A maximum of **04 students** (Age limit: **21 years**) can be selected from your campus for this program. The registration fees (Residential/Non-residential) and travel expenses for all participating students will be borne by their respective institutions. Criteria for Ideal Selection: Only one student per year from a single course. /Not more than one student from a single district./Representatives from different states should be selected./Among research scholars, one male and one female student (total two) will be selected./Selected students must not be affiliated with any political party or student organization./The age limit must be strictly followed./Priority should be given to newly enrolled/fresh students./Students who have participated in the Youth Parliament in previous years should not be nominated.

Scale and Diversity of Participation

About Session & Organizers:

On the auspicious occasion of the Indian New Year - 2083 and the centenary year of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh, the Indian Youth Parliament (in the context of Sanskrit and Indian languages) is being organized at Resham Bagh, Nagpur, for the preservation and promotion of Indian languages and the nation's cultural and linguistic heritage. The objective of this event is to create awareness among the youth about democratic values and to encourage communication skills in Indian languages, including Sanskrit. Your decision last year to release the Sanskrit translation of the Indian Constitution and the Sanskrit translation of the Lok Sabha proceedings is highly commendable, as it has reinforced the notion of Sanskrit as a language of the people. This praiseworthy act has provided an opportunity to celebrate the richness of India's linguistic heritage and reaffirms the Constitution as the guiding framework of the country. This special session will enhance the contemporary relevance of the Sanskrit language, increase its appeal, and confirm that Sanskrit, along with the scriptures, is a simple, accessible, and popular language. The event will include the following 22 Indian languages recognized under the Constitution, including Sanskrit: Assamese, Bengali, Bodo, Dogri, Gujarati, Hindi, Kashmiri, Kannada, Konkani, Maithili, Malayalam, Manipuri, Marathi, Nepali, Odia, Punjabi, Tamil, Telugu, Santali, Sindhi, and Urdu, along with two major classical languages, Pali and Prakrit. Sanskrit is permanently present not only in India but also in cities and villages around the world. From this perspective, this four-day brainstorming session of Sanskrit-loving speakers and participants will give a new dimension not only to Sanskrit but also to other Indian languages. Languages will be crucial in the vision of a developed India in 2047.

In this event, youth from more than 500 districts across the country will come together to strengthen the interconnectedness of Indian languages. The Central Sanskrit University has been given the opportunity to host this program. The university's headquarters are in New Delhi, while it has 14 campuses across the country, more than 30 model colleges, and over 300 institutions engaged in the preservation and promotion of Indian knowledge systems, Indian culture, and various fields of scholarship, as well as Indian languages. The organizing institution, the Indian Youth Parliament, has been working in this direction for the past two decades in various parts of the country, and has organized 28 sessions so far, from the far Northeast and the Himalayan region of Ladakh to Gujarat in the west and Central India. These events aim to activate leadership skills and social awareness in the future generation, and to train them to be mindful of their duties and rights. In these sessions, young people from various states, representing diverse cultures, environments, appearances, and attire, come together to realize the vision of "One India, Great India" and embody the principle of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" (the world is one family). It is believed that this event will further refine and empower India as it leads the world of the future. The session in Jaipur, Rajasthan, on the occasion of World Democracy Day, is the most important link in this chain. In this session, governors and

speakers of legislative assemblies from various states, along with representatives of the legislature, and distinguished personalities from diverse fields such as academia, social sciences, and economics, engage with young people pursuing higher education. They directly involve these young people in policy formulation, implementation, and review, understanding their independent perspectives and activities, and addressing their queries.

For the **Indian Youth Parliament (IYP) Nagpur National Session (March 20-23, 2026)**, the agenda extends beyond the central theme of "Indian Languages" to include several critical global and local topics.

4. **Social Harmony (Samarasata):** Bridging gaps in society to ensure equitable progress for all communities.
5. **Civic Duty (Nagarik Kartavya):** Emphasizing the responsibilities of citizens in achieving the **Viksit Bharat 2047** vision.


